Basic Health insurance is mandatory for all international students. Health insurance costs will be charged every term until students provide proof of MSP.

Books & supplies

Student kits will be available for purchase on the first day of class but should be paid in advance at the Registration Office.

In addition to the fees outline above, the following costs apply:

- Appropriate clothing adhering to the dress code; black or grey pants, closed-toe black shoes (no sneakers), and hair and makeup done daily
- Purchase of individual consumables after those in the student kits are consumed (ie: latex gloves, bobby pins, etc.)
